Subject: Proposition 56 Notice

Proposition 56, the California Healthcare, Research and Prevention Tobacco Tax Act of 2016, now includes proposed supplemental payments for physicians participating in Medi-Cal fee-for-service and Medi-Cal Managed Care. Once the proposal is approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), the funding will be provided to each health plans. The health plan will then put in place a process to implement the supplemental payments to eligible physicians. Proposition 56 supplemental payments will be applicable to the following CPT codes:

IEHP does not advise physicians of the appropriate codes to bill for services rendered. IEHP expects that the physician and their administration will accurately determine the appropriate coding when billing and reporting encounters.

In light of the codes specified by Proposition 56, we would like to take this opportunity to remind our physician network of the importance of accurately reporting all CPT and ICD-10 diagnosis codes when submitting claims and/or encounters to IEHP and our IPA partners. While the preventive medicine services codes 99381-5 and 99391-5 are not on the Proposition 56 list, these codes directly contribute to HEDIS results, which impact IEHP and our physicians. Any substitution of 99211-5 or 99201-5 codes for these preventive medicine services codes would result in a negative impact on IEHP HEDIS quality results, physician P4P results and physician payment for Global Quality P4P.

Thank you for your partnership with IEHP. As with the ACA 1202 payments, IEHP plans to do our best to provide timely and maximized payments to our physicians through the Proposition 56 program.
