What is the Inland Regional Center?

Inland Regional Center (IRC) has been providing case management and services to promote greater independence, empowerment, and inclusion to people with developmental disabilities in San Bernardino and Riverside counties since 1972.

IRC provides services for people in the Inland Empire with:

- Intellectual disabilities (ID)
- Autism spectrum disorder (ASD)
- Cerebral palsy
- Epilepsy



How can IEHP help?

IRC and Inland Empire Health Plan (IEHP) work together to help members access the care they need, including:

- Case management
- Care coordination
- Call and referral support
- Addressing gaps in medical care

The IEHP IRC team can assist current IRC consumers or anyone who would like to learn more about IRC resources.

Who is eligible for IRC services?

Early Start (0-36 months)

- Developmental delay of 25% or more
- Established risk condition or at risk of substantial developmental disability

3 Years Old and Over

- A diagnosis of ID, ASD, cerebral palsy, epilepsy or a disability like ID.
- The condition must originate prior to age 18, cause a substantial limitation for the person and likely be lifelong.

The IRC intake team must review all applications, consent forms and records to determine eligibility.

What are some common IRC Services?

- Goal-driven personal plans
- Day programs
- Living options
- Employment options
- Social recreation
- Caregiver support
