Why take a Sexual History?

- Allows for early intervention and treatment, especially for HIV and syphilis.
- Can have a **significant impact** on overall health and well-being.

Assists physicians in reporting to local health departments for follow-up with patient partner services, including contact tracing and anonymous notifications. *

*It is important to share with Members that their sexual history is kept confidential and partners are notified anonymously.

We understand taking a sexual history may not be a comfortable conversation for some patients, but it is important to remind patients it is a routine part of their care.

Addressing the rise of STIs in our communities is something we can't do alone. It's crucial as a health system that we work together to make a difference in the lives of our members throughout the Inland Empire.
